### Important weather reminders

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

• All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or

- All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Non-bused students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

### February is Registration Month:

Do you have a child who will be starting pre-primary or primary this fall? It's soon time to register!

Registration for the 2025-26 school year begins on February 1. To ensure we have the right staff and supports in place for September, it's important that we gather enrolment numbers now.

**Tip:** Before you begin, make sure you have the following documents in electronic form (image, PDF or Word document):

- Proof of identity/age with one of the following: birth certificate, passport, immigration papers, or legal adoption papers) if you are new to the HRCE; ·
- Proof of home address (a recently dated official government or utility document with your current address that includes your name and date, such as water bill, power bill,

internet bill, home fuel bill, a tax receipt, property assessment or a mortgage contract); and  $\cdot$

## Cell phone policy: Reminders (update re. smart watches):

Beginning last September, every student was expected to have their personal cell phone turned off and stored during instructional time. Students in Grades PP - 5 are to turn off and store their cell phones for the entire school day, including non-instructional times and on the bus). Exceptions may be made to address students' individual needs (medical/ability) when determined in consultation with the Student Planning Team, that includes parents/caregivers.

Some students are starting to wear smartwatches to school. It is important to ensure that students understand that the cell phone policy applies to these devices for texting, calls and internet use during school time. If your child has a smart watch we appreciate you having these conversations at home with them so that they understand the policy and expectations. **Thanks for your support.**
